#### **HWBDG Approved Project Funding**

**Women's Essentials Badminton Course,** William Penn leisure Centre, approved 30 March Submitted by Craig Hughes, Active Communities Manager.

Briefly: 'The programme will be aimed at Women over the age of 18 and will look to target 16 female participants to the Essentials Badminton programme. The Essentials badminton programme will help engage more female participants to the sport of badminton and support participants in feeling confident enough to engage in the Everyone Active No Strings badminton programmes which are due to be set up alongside the Essentials course at both William Penn, and South Oxhey leisure centre with support from Badminton England.'

'I'm very pro this project and good to see Everyone Active is committed to providing the facility time to get projects like this up and running. I've had a number of communications with Craig and am looking to get BE to support with junior equipment (racketpack / SmashUp! bags) as he is keen to get a large programme of badminton activity going. HJBA and HBA: thoughts so far:

Shuttles – it would be interesting to see if anyone has carried out a sustainability study of feather v plastic. Can plastic shuttles be made from, or into recycled plastic, can feather shuttles be composted? The cardboard tubes are recyclable if the metal foil lining is removed.

There is a market for second hand feathered shuttles but it doesn't seem to be easily accessible? This could be improved?

Could also encourage clubs to ask facilities for their sustainability plans which might encourage halls to do more? We could provide input to new build sports halls.

Sports shoes – HSV is collecting used running shoes – not sure what happens to them, but they claim that it avoids them going into landfill.
