Facilities

Hertfordshire Sports Village

HSV, with Badminton England (BE) superior facilities, is home to Comets Junior and Senior Clubs, HJBA squads and some of their tournaments. As well as HBA's Restricted and Open there were several national and international BE tournaments were again held there, and all were well attended. Availability for clubs is decreasing to almost nil.

Gosling Sports Park and the General Lack of Badminton courts in WG

Gosling, with BE standard facilities, was until 2019 the only Welwyn Garden sports facility open weekdays when Herts Police were given tenure week-days. The short information, recently, is that the Police 'will continue using the area for the foreseeable future'. WH Council has undertaken a consultation on sports facilities, and the Planning Department's Local Plan will acknowledge the shortfall. The long information is in the Appendix.

Hatfield Leisure Centre

This centre, with solid woodblock floor, now has bouncy castle in the main sports hall from Friday evening until Sunday mid-day. This has disrupted Swifts Friday evening's schedule (starting earlier), and prevented Saturday and Sunday junior and adult sessions and tournaments continuing.

Birchwood Leisure Centre

Birchwood continues to support badminton with good BE standard facilities.

Schools

Onslow St Audrey School's New Facility

Opened last year. Nick Goode and Steve Willis visited: no availabilities.

Monks Walk School's New Facility

Plans to start building the new 4 court facility in the summer. DB and BE's Facility Manager have tried without success to contact with support. Milan Johnston will try, too.

The Ridgeway and Stanborough are available for bookings.

HBA AGM 2 June 2025 Summary

Several clubs are having difficulties obtaining courts, and affording the price increases: BE and HSP are aware.

Leagues are doing OK: some slightly increasing some slightly decreasing.

Appendix

Gosling Sports Park and the General Lack of Badminton courts in WG

Gosling was until 2019 the only Welwyn Garden sports facility open weekdays. In 2019 when the Herts Police took over the weekday occupancy it was to be until their facilities were built – by 2024. At the time there were hundreds of adult and junior users, including schools. As chair of WHBC in 1998 and 2009 I had got Sports England refurbishment grants for the sports hall (about £70k), so I was personally unhappy about the situation. In February this year a letter, via our MP Andrew Lewin, from Jeremy Lake Partnership Manager GLL, stated the Police 'will continue using the area for the foreseeable future', and, 'we remain open to future discussions about its continued use, particularly as it relates to ensuring the availability of indoor sports venues for the local community.' Recently the Police have taken over one of the squash courts.

At the WH Communities1st meeting 21 May, I pointed out that whereas Hatfield has 25 badminton courts available weekdays, WG has none. By granting an extension of use to Herts Police they were given priority over the health of the people WG. Milan Johnston, Sports Partnership Officer, stated 'that the council are aware of the shortfall of badminton courts in Welwyn garden city and the council have commissioned for the 'built facilities strategy' to be updated which will also identify the shortfall. Unfortunately there are many budget constraints within the council and they are not in a position to build a new sports hall but there are options to explore utilising other facilities including campus west.

In response to my subsequent emailed concern on the lack of badminton courts to WH BC Executive Member for Planning, Cllr Rose Grewal, she replied: 'I share your view that physical and mental health and wellbeing is a key factor in promoting a healthier and a happier community. As you know we are in the process of developing a new Local Plan and I have asked officers to provide a response in relation to our emerging policy.'

So, we wait to see the public review of the consultation on the Sports Facilities Strategy later this year, and WH BC's Local Plan: 'A six-week public consultation on key topics will take place in Summer 2025'.

Alternative Venues

Gosling Development. For several years, with the help of BE Head Office, we have supported WHBC's Sports Facilities Strategy for developing Gosling with potentially 8 new courts. Owing to potential financial difficulties in developing the site WHBC have now abandoned any development at the site for the foreseeable future.

Oaklands College, St Albans £60M MasterPlan: Four yeare ago the college asked us to be involved in a potential 8 or 12 court sports hall, and we attended meetings and sent in our usage plans. Unfortunately, they have not re-engaged with us, despite further expressions of interest.
